



During an in-person visit to the facility, preauthorized visitors are to understand that the young person you will be visiting, and all others present in the facility, are afforded privacy protections set out in the Youth Criminal Justice Act. Under that law, making the identity of a young person public or available to the public is an offence that is subject to a penalty of imprisonment for up to 2 years, if convicted. For these reasons;

- All visitors will be asked to show their identification upon arrival.
- All visitors may be subject to a search before they are allowed to visit. Staff may visually inspect the contents of a visitor's:
 - o Purse
 - o Bag
 - o Packages
- Before entering the facility, visitors may be asked to leave purses, bags, and packages in their vehicles.
- Visitors are not allowed to bring any electronics into the facility, including:
 - o Cell phones and smartphones
 - o Smartwatches
 - o Pagers
 - o Computers, tablets, and laptops
 - o Radios
 - o Other electronic devices

No outside food, vapes, cigarettes, or lighters.

Youth(s) are searched after all visits.

Refusing a search

If a visitor refuses a search or, despite a search, there is still reasonable cause to suspect that a visitor is carrying contraband, the visitor will be denied access to the facility and will be asked to leave the premises.

Denying or ending visits

A visit may be denied or ended under the following circumstances:

- o The visitor is under the influence of drugs, alcohol or another substance
- o Sufficient visiting space is not available
- o Refusal by a youth or visitor to submit to search procedures

- Refusal or failure to produce accessible personal identification, or the visitor falsifying identifying information
- Violation of institutional rules by a visitor or youth
- The youth refuse the visit

The approved procedures for visits are posted. Facility staff also communicate these procedures to the young person (YP) through the YP's Information Guide, upon admission into the open Custody/Detention.

All visiting privileges may be suspended in response to security concerns or medical quarantine at the facility.
